PEACH HIGHLIGHTS

- Developed a formal relationship with Toronto Community Housing to coordinate shelter and support for community youth
- Expanded our Learning Beyond Adversity program to serve more youth in diverse ways, including at the PEACH facility and in youth homes
- Increased emphasis on mental health and well being, including Mental Health First Aid training
- Launched the Youth Gun Violence Prevention Program with new community youth workers and strategies
- Initiation of PEACH Radio as a community audio forum
- Preliminary study for establishment of a PEACH Bail Fund
- Summer Employment Program for youth to gain meaningful experience working in the community while acquiring academic credits
- Harm Reduction Outreach Program, a partnership with Black Creek Community Health Centre to establish peer support outreach teams
- Hosting the City of Toronto Pre-Charge Diversion program to administer educational and life-skills programs for community youth
- Within a month and half of reopening, we were regularly running at full capacity and able to welcome several young people from children's aid services.
